





Sully Car Show 2023 - June 18, 2023



The Sully show's Studebaker-Packard class saw a face-off between two super-charged Studebakers -- the 1963 Lark Daytona R-2 convertible, owned by Jeff Bradel, and my 1957 Golden Hawk. With their hoods open, the two cars got a lot of attention. Unfortunately, first place went to a beautiful 1933 Packard Roadster. My car got a second place and third place went to a 1941 Packard 4-door sedan. Although the black 4-door Packard was nice it was not terribly interesting. On the other hand, Jeff's car is set up for drag racing and was purchased that way from the dealership when it was new. Because at Sully "appearance" judging was used and Jeff's car is original and unrestored, it did not get the credit it deserves for the interesting way it was set up and its rich history. Best in Show was taken by a 1930 V-16 Cadillac limousine owned by Chris Cummings - an unrestored original car with only 8,000 original miles on it since new. 

Meet Rules

- All show vehicles will be classified by Bull Run Region upon arrival, and decisions are final.
- Stock vehicles, Class A, must be 25 years or older and reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications.
- Modified vehicles, Class B, must be 25 years old or older based on the vehicle's state registration.
- Post-1998 vehicles, whether stock or modified, are in Class C.
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes within the space allotted and must not interfere with other participants or traffic flow. Hoods must be open for best-of-show judging.
- All vehicles should have a charged fire extinguisher available.
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power.
- Once parked, vehicles must remain turned off until the meet is over at approximately 3:00 pm.
- Vehicles needing to exit earlier must be escorted off the field. Contact a Bull Run member to arrange escort.
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Car Corral and registered for the show as such.
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region.
- Pre-registration fees are non-refundable except for show cancellation by Bull Run Region.
- Late arrivals (after 11 am) may not be eligible for judging.

What Did You Do to Your Studebaker?

Pete Rutledge — '64 Studebaker Avanti R2

<u>Hog Troughs</u>: Would you believe it? Studebaker Avanti R5083 now has new hog troughs on both sides. It was a difficult and time-consuming job, but it's now completely done. Working very part-time, the left side took me months (I had a lot of questions, did a lot of research); the right side took me weeks (I knew what to do and how to do it). I have written a comprehensive narrative on hog trough replacement—after reading earlier accounts, my aim was to write the most comprehensive account to date. It's 6 pages long and will be longer after inserting pictures.

What I did with my four Studebakers **By Bob DeVore**

I purchased "My First Car in 1953. It was a 49 Champion Regal 4 Door. (18 year old kids don't usually go for 4 door sedans.) I put a lot of miles on it over the 3 years that I had it -- 2 trips to Martha's Vineyard, 6 round trips to Newark, NJ, and a trip to Amarillo, TX. It was there that I traded it in for a 1954 Ford (Y Block) V8. The Champion worked hard against the west Texas winds. The year was 1956. I was without a Studebaker for the next 27 years.

Then, in the Fall of 1983, I came upon an identical model sitting (or I should say lying) in a field. All the tires were flat and and the car was leaning to one side. Absolutely no seats were covered and the mice and ground squirrels had taken possession. Out of pity, I bought it and had it trailered home. All of the brakes were frozen but the engine was free. Over the next 12 years, I disassembled it, repaired, cleaned, and even took an upholstery class and did the entire interior. In 1995, I took it to Hershey and won a First Junior AACA. The next year, I drove it to Johnstown, PA, and got my Senior. Ten years later, with a lot of tro-




phies, my wife and I had just visited the (New) Studebaker Museum. They had no post war Studebakers prior to 1950. It was then that we made the decision to donate it as a memorial to my brother who first got me into Studebakers. Once again, we were without a Studebaker.

My wife, Anne, saw the Flamingo Hawk at the new museum and mentioned that if we were ever to get another Studebaker, that was what she wanted. Some time later, I got an opportunity to find a 61 Hawk, but it was white. I did

quite a bit of work on it and

had it painted. Attractive, but not a good cruising car for long trips. (It did not have power steering or A/C.)

Several years later, I bought a perfect cruiser. A 1964 Cruiser with both power steering and A/C. Only 45,000 miles on the odometer. All original. After a hair raising trip to Black Waters Falls, I realized that the brakes were not going to stop or slow me down. The wheel cylinders were totally packed with gunk. A com-





members was interested in buying my Cruiser. The buyer's son just had this Cruiser at last year's South Bend Meet and won a First with a score of 396. We now had the Hawk as our "One and Only." Two years ago and two knee replacements needed, I sold my remaining Studebaker. Sort of a post retirement decision that we all must make at some time.
